- 2 Remember children learn best by example, if you are relaxed and happy, your child will be. Appreciate good performance and skilful play from both sides.
- 3 Don not use foul or abusive language and do not harass players, coaches or parents, remember monkey see monkey do.
- 4 Applaud and encourage good play from all children, they love praise!
- 5 Do not coach or shout while spectating, if you and the coach are talking it may confuse your child. They learn best by being allowed to make their own decisions, good ones and bad ones!
- 6 We all want our children to do well, that's why sometimes its best to let them have go without any help from adults, they might just surprise us!
- 7 Stand well back from the boundary, it helps the children relax and enjoy themselves!
- 8 Children play for fun, winning is a bonus and there are no prizes for winning. Developing as a player and a person is the goal of Murton Cricket Academy.
- 9 Please remember the cricket club has a no smoking policy anywhere on the site, whether it be the pavilion, cricket field or car park.
- 10 Parents should not enter the changing rooms at any time unless asked to by the coach. Children should be dropped off and collected from outside of the changing rooms block.
- 11 Teach your child the spirit and laws of cricket.
